Palm/Passion Sunday

Holy Week begins April 1st. Holy Week becomes a time we reflect upon the last week of Christ's life on earth. At the beginning of the worship service, we will remember Palm Sunday as the children process in with palm branches. As the service continues, we will hear the words from Mark's Gospel that record Jesus words and actions during this holiest of weeks. As we finish our Lenten disciplines, this is a week that we reflect upon our commitment to living a new life in Christ.

Maundy Thursday

Cherry Log Christian Church will present a very unique service on Maundy Thursday, April 5th. It will feature strings-accompanied segments from Requiems by Gabriel Faure and John Rutter (the Agnus Dei section from both plus one additional section from Rutter), a difficult but beautiful piece by Craig Courtney, and a strikingly beautiful setting of Christ's last night in the garden praying by Daniel Gawthrop, all performed by the Chancel Choir. As a part of the service, we will celebrate the Last Supper, remembering the words of Jesus Christ and the image of Christ as The Lamb of God. Child care will be available.

Friday Noon Service

The highlight of the Noon Friday service is the Stations of the Cross, or sometimes called The Way of Sorrow. We will follow the way of Jesus to the cross and pause to pray over his way of sorrow. If we are not careful, we will miss the meaning of Holy Week if we do not pause and reflect and pray.

Easter Sunday

We will celebrate the risen Christ with two worship services on Sunday, April 8th. The services will be at 9:15 AM and 10:55 AM. The celebration is that Jesus is returning to us with the gift of new life. The scriptures, the hymns, the prayers, and communion all will lift up the risen Savior. But each of these also will lift up our need to live new lives in the risen Christ.

Adult Education Committee

We will be finishing up the current class on the "Chronological History of the Bible" on Palm Sunday. There will be no Sunday School classes held on Easter. We believe that this will be an appropriate study as we leave Easter and journey to Pentecost and the founding of the church. Rev. Jim Tingle will lead this study.

After completing Carl Hendrickson's Wednesday night series of the "Development of the Church Calendar" by March 28th, we will break until the last Wednesday of April (25th), when the Constitution Bylaws Committee has asked for the opportunity to go over the new Constitution and Bylaws. After church Sunday I heard the same comment three times or maybe it was thirteen times. It was at the kitchen window, in the hallway, in the fellowship hall at table. The words, "Thank you" abounded from the lips of people licking their "chops". Thank you to Judy and George Barrett, who Sunday after Sunday, welcome all of us to the table in fellowship hall! This is their ministry; they feel it is their call to serve Christ. But we still want to say those wonderful words to Judy and George, "THANK YOU!"

FROM MY HEART....TO YOUR HEART

I still remember that snowy day when I tied my shoes for the first time. I wanted to help my father put the snow chains on his patrol car. Okay, I wanted to watch and be a bother. Mother was cooking breakfast and did not have time to wash her hands, keep an eye on sausage frying, and tie my shoes. "You need to learn to tie your own shoes. You will not always have me to tie your shoes." I was furious, furious enough to tie my own shoes! And I was proud and independent!

At times we like to have people wait on us, to do things for us. Yet we miss opportunities to grow and to stretch. Also we may be tempted to think that Jesus did and will do everything for us. "He did it all and I have to do nothing." I would like for us to think about that statement.

Jesus called us as disciples, to do greater things that he had done. He did not make us dependent puppets. Jesus shows us how to live, how to love, and how to forgive. So as we enter Holy Week, what is it that Jesus is showing us to do?

In Matthew's gospel when Jesus is arrested, one of the disciples took his sword to defend Jesus and in the process cuts the ear of the slave of the high priest. Jesus tells the disciple to put his sword up. This is not the way of Jesus or of God. Jesus clearly states that he must, like the rest of us, pass through the ground of his own powerlessness and hopelessness.

Jesus yields. This is essential for salvation. Earlier Jesus says that one must lose life to save life. So in this scene of his arrest, Jesus puts into practice what he says. He puts his faith in God. He gives up his being for the being of God.


I know we anticipate resurrection, but wait. Wait. Wait and give your own self time to yield, to release, to move yourself out of the way and for God to be your focus, your mind, and your heart. We want the resurrection; but my friends, resurrection only comes through death, through giving up ourselves.

Holy Week is a time to focus on the life of Jesus, his last week on earth. Yet Holy Week is also a time for us to focus on being Christ-like, giving up our lives, not being in control, and trusting in God. What a Holy Week it would be to die to ourselves (not to physically hurt ourselves) and be resurrected in Christ!

Christ did not do it for us. He showed us the way to God, a way of giving up to be saved, a way to die to live. How powerful this image is. How freeing it is.

Legacy Giving

On February 28, members of the Finance and Stewardship Committee along with some other interested CLCC members met with Randy Johnson to begin planning the implementation of a Legacy Giving program for our church. Randy is SE Regional VP for the Christian Church Foundation, the denomination's organization that assists churches with implementing Legacy Giving programs and managing permanent funds.

Many church members give faithfully during our lifetime. Many want to see their support continue after our death. Through bequests to the church, members can express their love for the church and continue to contribute to the ongoing mission and ministry of the church in a meaningful way.

As a follow up to the February meeting, a team has volunteered to draft a Legacy Giving Policy for Board approval. The policy will state how bequests and gifts to a permanent endowment fund will be managed and how funds will be disbursed and used. Typical policies from other churches provide that Legacy Gifts will be maintained in a permanent endowment and annual disbursements from the endowment fund will be used in specific ways. Most churches specify that a certain percent of annual disbursements will be used for ongoing ministry, mortgage reduction, building maintenance or expansion or community ministry. The policy will also designate trustees that will be responsible for managing the endowment fund, and promoting legacy giving participation by members. When the CLCC team has a draft of our proposed policy it will be published for congregation input before being submitted to the Board for approval.

Once the policy is approved, the Legacy Gift trustees will offer educational seminars to explain the program, offer estate planning assistance through the Christian Church Foundation, and offer easy ways for members to participate as Legacy donors. This can be a very meaningful program for members and for the life of the church and is another very exciting chapter in our growth and ministry.

Members of the committee will be making presentations and answering questions during the Sunday School hour on Sunday, April 15, and will hold "town hall" style meetings on Wednesday evening, April 25, and Saturday morning, April 28. We encourage everyone to review the proposals, attend these sessions, ask questions and give feedback to the committee. The committee will use this feedback to make adjustments and revisions and then submit the proposal to the Board for approval on May 19, and subsequently to the congregation. Our proposal will be to operate under these new documents for a two year period, making any adjustments as experience may suggest.
