

Dr. Paul C. Pryor, Intentional Interim Minister



Dr. Paul C. Pryor is an intentional interim minister with twenty-six years of ministerial experience. He received his Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry degrees from Brite Divinity School in Ft. Worth, Texas and has served churches in Texas, Indiana, Illinois, Oregon, Virginia, Montana and California. Dr. Pryor's wide range of experience in working with churches across the country gives him a unique understanding of the dynamics of congregations going through transition. While the temptation for many in the congregation is to rush to find a "settled" minister, Dr. Pryor sees this in between time as a special period of grace; a time of prayer and discernment in which the congregation is drawn closer together and closer to God. The interim period gives the congregation the time it needs to reflect on its past accomplishments while looking forward to the next chapter of its life.

Paul is originally from Baltimore, Maryland. He enlisted in the U.S. Army following high school and served two of his four years of service in Viet Nam. It was while in the Army that he met his wife, Patricia. They were married on the day he was discharged. Paul worked as a carpenter in Baltimore and Washington D.C. until he felt called to ministry. It was then that he moved his family to Springfield, Missouri where he attended Central Bible College. Upon completion of his undergraduate degree they moved to Ft. Worth, Texas where he began his studies at Texas Christian University. It was there that he became acquainted with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) which resulted in his long career with the denomination.

Over the years Paul's love of God and the church has grown as he has dedicated himself to helping congregations live out their commitment to the gospel of Jesus Christ. Paul's belief is that it is through the ministry of the local church that the work of God becomes most evident.

Dr. Pryor has three daughters and six grandchildren. His wife, Patricia, passed away in 2009.

Dr. Pryor will be starting with Cherry Log Christian Church on September 1. On Sunday, September 4, he will preach his first sermon in a special welcoming service. Our two worship services will come together for 10:30 joint service in the Sanctuary. Worship will be followed by a luncheon in Fellowship Hall, at which there will be an informal time of presentation and an opportunity to visit with and get to know our new Intentional Interim Minister.

Transition Time

Here at the beginning of August we are well into the beginning of our transition. I know you have felt it, as have I and your board. We have been working hard over the last few months to deal with a number of transition issues. Let me take just a moment to review them:

We have said our goodbyes and give a proper farewell to our beloved David and Jane.

We have arranged an “interim before the Interim” with our Interim Associate Minister, Robin Norsworthy, taking the lead and involving a group of our own ordained ministers to challenge and inspire us week-by-week.

We held a Town Meeting with Denise Bell, our Regional Minister, who gave us an overview of the transition time and challenged us to be our best during this year.

We have sought and found an Intentional Interim Minister. The Board has unanimously approved the selection of Dr. Paul C. Pryor, a professional intentional interim minister with twenty-six years of ministerial experience. You will find some biographical information about Paul in this issue of the *Cherrylogue*.

We have begun the Search and Call process with the Disciples of Christ Region and General Church Staff.

Now, let me take a moment to look ahead:

We will make a brief presentation at each worship service during the month of August on aspects of the Transition Time, to provide information on the process.

We will hold a second Town Hall meeting on the Transition on Sunday, August 7, during the Christian Education hour (9:30-10:30am), to allow open discussion and questions from the congregation.

We will welcome Dr. Paul Pryor as our Intentional Interim Minister in a special joint service on September 4, at 10:30am, combining Celebrate Early and Morning Worship. The service will be followed by a luncheon in Fellowship Hall to get acquainted with Dr. Pryor. Put it on your calendar now.

We will begin to implement the Transition process immediately after Paul comes. I don't have space here to cover the entire process, but if you attend the Town Hall meeting you will get a full overview. During this process we will follow the “Best Practices” guidelines of the Christian Church, our bylaws, and the leadership of Dr. Pryor. We do expect that the entire process will take a year.

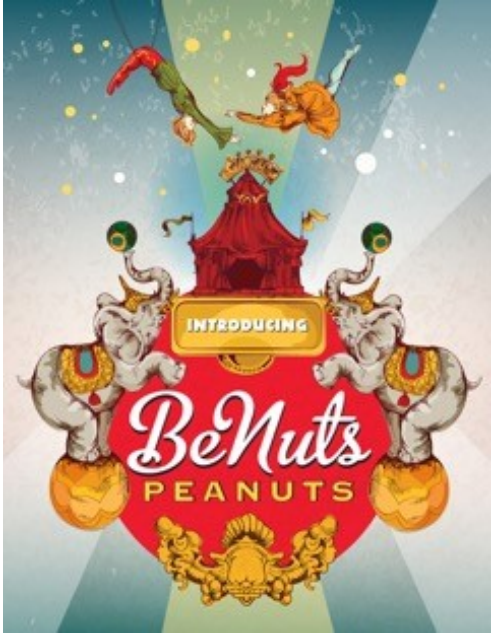

Caring for Our CLCC/DOC Family

One of the basic care systems at CLCC has the Congregation divided into flocks. A flock is a group of members, active visitors who are led by an Elder. An Elder, who is elected by the Congregation, is described in the Bylaws as “an encourager, mentor, shepherd, and servant”. Each Elder is responsible for making sure each person has a strong connection to the church, a voice in matters of the church.

When the new leadership begins duties on July 1 of each year, the flocks and Elders are assigned. Elders make contact with flock members to welcome them to the flock. Elders also provide contact information should one need to talk to an Elder. Flock and Elder information is also available on the church website, clccdoc.org (go to the Member dropdown and you will find a link, “Flock List”. This website flock list is always the most current list. For those who do not have internet access, a copy of the flock list may be requested from your Elder.)



Here are some of the ways an Elder might be of help:

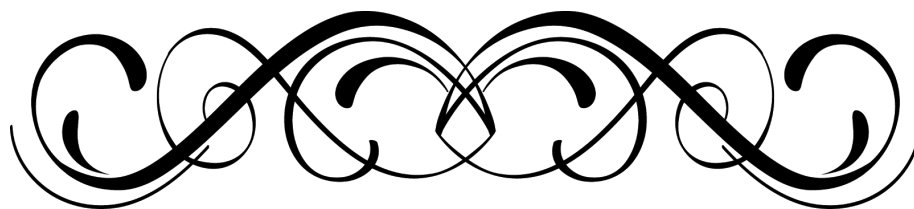
Your Elder is available to answer or help you find answers to your questions (ex. information about the Disciple tradition; additional information or contact information for a specific small group or church activity; information about the website or other church communication tools; etc.).

If you need support for a personal matter; your Elder will be there for you or will help you find the right resource (minister, Stephen Minister, one of the support groups, etc.). In times of crisis or when you need support or help from your church, please contact your Elder. Your Elder will likewise periodically check in with you to see if you have any needs.

If you wish you could get to know people in the church better; your Elder will host gatherings for your flock that provide just such an opportunity. Your Elder will be glad to introduce you to members who may have similar interests or backgrounds.

If you have a concern about the church; your Elder is available to listen.

Should you have any questions or concerns about the Elder/flock care system, please feel free to talk to your Elder or talk to Marsha Kipling, chair of the Elders.



A New Sunday School Class: Ecology Theology

After attending the Michael Dowd “Mountain Top Lectures” on Ecology Theology, I talked with David Griffin about starting a Sunday School class to discuss this topic. We will also view the DVD produced by Yale University: [Journey of the Universe](#). It seeks to answer the question: “What role do humans play in this 14 billion-year process, and how do we connect with the intricate web of life?”.

We will seek to follow where our interests and questions lead us as a new group of “Seekers” at Cherry Log Christian Church.

Phil and I agreed to get this class started with a plan to create a team that could assist in leading the class. We are not experts on this topic, but we want a time to meet with like-minded folk to gain knowledge and share ideas. Phil and I would like to call this “Carl’s Class” for Carl Hendrickson was not only a theologian but a scientist as well. He was part of the initial planning for this class. We will miss his voice in the room, but for those of us who knew him, his influence will be felt.

We hope to reach some new people from the community who are interested in Ecology Theology. If you know of someone who might be interested, tell him/her about the class. We will be learning together.

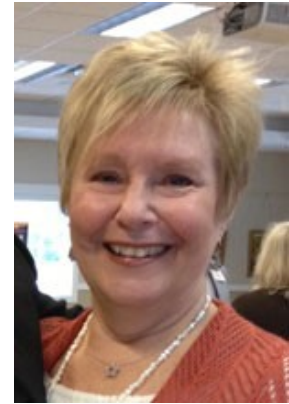
