Finance Committee Report:

May Revenue, \$35,872 is in line with recent months, but \$5,194 less than May expenses which were \$41,066. As we have been warning in recent messages, May expense is inflated because there were three payroll periods in May instead of two, accounting for most of the expense overrun. June will also have three mortgage payments instead of two which will add \$5000 to normal June expense. These "extra" payroll and mortgage payments occur every year because payroll and mortgage are paid every two weeks, not monthly. This year's "extra" payments are in line with prior years. The first five months of 2017 look much like the first five months of 2016 as shown below:

Looking forward, the important information is that more unusual expenses are ahead of us. This year we will have an external audit (\$2500) instead of internal. The Search Team will have travel and miscellaneous expenses (estimate \$5000). There will be expenses associated with the new pastor arriving, like moving expense (estimate \$8000). These items are anticipated in the budget but there is no cash reserve to pay for them, other than the General reserve of \$18,000. You will also see new fans and LED lights in the sanctuary, part of the energy improvement program. These expenses are covered by a cash reserve set aside from the sale of the Craddock Center. Your continued faithfulness in sacrificial giving is needed.

2. LETTING GO

Our past is very important to us. The past is the story of our life's journey so far but NOT the story of our future. "He also told them a parable: No one tears a piece from a new garment and sews it on an old garment; otherwise the new will be torn, and the piece from the new will not match the old. And no one puts new wine into old wine skins; otherwise the new wine will burst the skins and will be spilled and the skins will be destroyed. But new wine must be put into fresh wine skins." NRSV Luke 5: 36-39.

Give thanks and celebrate the good things as well as the difficult things in our past that increased our strength and allowed us to grow.

4. PRAYER FOR THE ANGRY:

Everyone get angry sometimes. It seems to be part of our communication with ourselves, others near us and even the world.

Anger can sometimes serve a useful purpose, such as motivating us to raise money for a cause or bringing attention to a condition that needs to be changed. In James 1: 19-20, We find "You must understand beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger, for your anger does not produce righteous."

Anger takes us to a sorrowful place where we lose our balance and let our mind and hearts be controlled by others. "Any person capable of angering you becomes your master; he (sic) can anger you when you permit yourself to be disturbed by him." Author unknown.

Let us pray that our hearts and minds will stay focused on our vision statement, "provides a loving sense of community."

1. FOR THE CHOSEN TO SERVE:

God, our colleagues have taken on a huge responsibility of which they are aware. As they begin their process, there are initial issues with which they will need to deal. 3. PRAYERS FOR COMMUNITY

Living in a community is both difficult and life giving. It challenges us and sustains us. We are called to be a community that fully displays the love of God and connects people from all walks of life, people who are at different places in their personal life and spiritual journey.

We do not have to be or all believe alike, but if we provide a community that is safe for all, we must be able to recognize and respect that we have differences, but realize we can listen and learn from each other. Being defensive about differences cause us to be unkind and unable to offer God's infinite mercy to all who walk with us in our shared journey as we seek grace and peace – the kingdom of God on earth.

Have you ever taken a job and later found out what was expected was different from what was told to you? Based on input from all of us, the Steering Committee developed a profile for our church. The Search Committee is searching for a minister whose profile matches our needs.

Pray that the committee will have clarity to match a candidate's profile to ours; that the committee will not settle for too little or aim too high, making our requirements unreasonable or unobtainable; that they can discern what will be the best match for the church we love.

James1:5a "...if any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given him."

7. ASKING THE RIGHT QUESTIONS

Our search committee will begin interviewing candidates with the most promise to be our new pastor.

Pray that our committee will determine the right questions to ask as they represent the church through the interview process. Pray that their questions will give them a true picture of the candidate so that the one who comes to us will be the one that we truly need.

Matthew 7:7 "Ask and you shall receive..."

8. PRAY FOR HEARING GOD'S VOICE:

Pray that the Search Committee will hear God's voice with clarity and feel peace as they discern who they should interview. Pray that as they read applications, listen to sermon samples and talk with candidates, they will place the Church's needs and desires before their own.

John 10:14 "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep, and they know me."

9. PRAYERS FOR THE FUTURE PASTOR AND FAMILY:

Pray that the future pastor and pastor's family will feel the same peace and excitement that the search committee feels about the candidate. Pray that the pastor and family will have clarity and will know if this is the next step in ministry to which God has called them.

Philippians 4:7 "and the peace of God which passeth all understanding shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."

10.PRAY FOR PEACE FOR THE CONGREGATION:

Pray that the entire congregation will feel a sense of peace and confirmation as the pastor is confirmed. Pray that no person would have an agenda that would cause a distraction or deterrent from God's work throughout the church process.

Pray that the new pastor and family have a smooth transition into the new church and community.

Colossians: 3:14 Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which ties everything in unity."

Life is short and we do not have much time to gladden the hearts of those who travel with us, so be swift to love, make haste to be kind and go in peace to love and serve the Lord.
