# Visit Our Contemporary Bible Class - Sundays at 9:30AM

This class is planned for those desiring in-depth Bible study and its application to our faith and real-life experiences. We often look at contemporary and earlier interpretations, but the focus is on how it speaks to us.

We study passages for each Sunday following the Revised Common Lectionary— sometimes all the readings for that day, sometimes one. The facilitator (primarily Charles Walls or a class member he invites) enables the discussion, but the heart of our lesson comprises the reflections and comments from members. We love our class and almost every Sunday find it interesting, insightful, stimulating, exciting. It keeps the Bible relevant and vital to our lives.



### FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

July Revenue of \$36,207 is in line with recent months and \$3,345 more than July expenses which were \$32,862. It is good to see revenues exceed expenses in July. The year 2017 continues to track 2016 with the net loss though July for each year virtually the same as shown in the table below:

The declining trend in revenue relates directly to attendance. Average weekly attendance for the year 2016 was 162. Through July of this year average weekly attendance is 138. The reduction in attendance is somewhat offset by increased giving per person attending, which is about \$8.00 per person, per week higher than in 2016. Your sacrificial giving is helping and is very much appreciated. Many of us believe the transition year we are going through is the primary reason attendance is down. The excitement we feel about our new pastor suggests that attendance should begin to bounce back once he is here.

### KENYA MISSION TRIP

Michael Agwande, the founder of Life for Children Ministries, was introduced to the Cherry Log congregation by Bill Groce in 2016. Michael is an HIV/AIDS orphan. He wanted to help the children who were like him. The orphans needed homes. So instead of building orphanages, Michael worked to create homes for the families of the children. He set up his ministry to help with food, clothes, schooling and homes. The ministry also works with the street boys in Kisumu who do not have families and are homeless.

In order to help Michael, our church collected money on Mothers Day 2016 and raised \$8000 to build eight widows houses. In June of 2017, we collected more that \$2000 for Widows Houses. In July of 2016, we raised \$2600 to help build a well to provide clean water for the villages. Michael visited us several times during 2016. He and his group are so appreciative of our help. During his visits, we talked about a mission trip to help build the houses we have funded. After several months of discussion, a mission team has been formed. The team will leave Atlanta on October 10 and return on October 23. Members on the mission team are Wendy and Bill Cox, Dorothy Morford, Becky Walls, and Jane Carwell. We are asking that you add us to your prayer list so that we can be the hands and feet of Jesus while we are in Kenya. We will visit with and worship with the street boys, teach classes, play games, build two widows houses, meet and visit with the guardians and their children, and we will meet the women who are being trained to become economically self-sufficient.

Here are some stories from the mission team, explaining why they want to go to Kenya.

I have always enjoyed working with small and primitive by our standchildren and their families. Since I have been retired, I have not felt that I was very useful. I enjoy working as a volunteer with our Outreach projects but I have needed to do more. When the opportunity to go to Kenya to work as a part of a mission ministry, I knew I wanted to be part of the group. I am looking forward to working with the children and their families. It will be such a privilege to represent the people of Cherry Log Christian Church. Having worked at a Habitat Build, I have seen the effect a new home has on a family. The Widows Houses are very

ards but they provide a home that is dry and safe. The women and their children will be able to go inside out of the rain and stay dry. They will be able to close the door and windows and be safe. Becky and I are going to read to the younger children. They speak English, but it is proper English not southern English! Hope they understand us! We are all so excited at the opportunity to show God s love to the people involved with the Life for Children Ministries.

Thank you to those who have given to our mission trip. Many of

you have attended our fundraisers and made donations to help cover our expenses. We will have one more fundraiser on Saturday, Sept 23. We will have another movie night. I hope you can attend.

I think this will be a life changing event for all of us. I cannot express the appreciation that I have for all of the help that has been received. What a blessing it is to be a

part of Cherry Log Christian Church.
