A Moment With Our Pastor...

Greetings, Church!

It is my honor and pleasure to share with you in this edition of the CherryLogue some of the ways we are preparing for another season of life in the church.

Coming up in short order (August 4th, 2019) is our CLCC Committee Faire. If you are asking yourself what a Committee Faire is, let me help! The Committee Faire has asked all the leaders of our church's committees and ministry groups to prepare a simple display and some helpful talking points which will highlight for the rest of the congregation the mission and purpose of their group, share some of what the group has done to bless the congregation, and what is on the horizon for their work and witness. I appreciate the positive and energetic response by our leaders at this opportunity to showcase just how much love and dedication exists across all constituencies of the church. I am convinced that when you enter the Fellowship Hall, you will be proud of our Church's witness and inspired to find a place to contribute to our efforts to *be* the hands and feet of Christ. Please plan to make your way through the faire on August 4th, after 10:55 a.m. service.

I also wanted to make you aware of how some of our committees are beginning to do the challenging work of evaluating our current systems and practices and offering suggestions for future ways of doing and being church together. I want to highlight two groups especially: *Worship Committee* and *Membership Committee*.

The Worship Committee has been holding regular and ongoing discussions about how we can create meaningful worship experiences which will honor God's desire to be with us through genuine and authentic spirituality, honor the time we ask the congregation to offer the church, honor those who come to visit our church for the first time, and honor the longstanding Disciples tradition that has made way for this church to be. Often, balancing those priorities can reveal some seemingly divergent paths forward. I would ask that you keep the worship committee in prayer as they discern the will of God. You will remember that at the end of June, we had a 10:55 a.m. service that felt different than we might be used to. Instead of having an offering meditation and passing the plates, there were stations where one's offering could be brought forward. Instead of passing trays with communion, the congregation was invited to share communion by intinction. We have been trying out passing peace to our neighbor instead of trying to pass it to the whole church. These are ways that the Worship Committee is gathering data and perspectives about how different practices can either enhance or detract from our experience of worship. These kinds of trials will continue as the discernment of what God is doing next continues. Some changes might be invigorating for you, some might feel uncomfortable. But I humbly ask that you keep a gracious and open mind when you encounter a change in worship and remember that your sisters and brothers in Christ serving on the Worship Committee are doing their best to honor God's will and the will of God's people (as is your Pastor!).

The second area of work in the church which I wanted to highlight is *Membership*. I have asked the leadership of the Membership Committee to be prepared to think with me about how we can better offer methods of communication and education about CLCC, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), and the movement of God's love in the world. Work is beginning which will hopefully lead us to launch a Membership class for interested visitors (and members too), so that all the FAQs about CLCC can be addressed in a thorough and succinct way. Membership will also be considering more intentional methods and practices of welcoming visitors and inviting them to continue to build a relationship with this congregation. Membership committee is charged with asking the probing questions which will help us to understand how our unchurched and no longer-churched neighbors might be invited to CLCC in ways that are effective and authentic. In a time when church attendance across the country is in a steep decline, we are growing. The members of the membership committee will do the work of trying to understand how it is that we are growing and how can we support that growth in ways which will yield even more good fruit for the Lord.

There is much more happening here at CLCC which would fit as "the challenging work of evaluating our current systems/ practices and offering suggestions for future ways of doing and being church together." But alas, this article is too long already. If you are intrigued and inspired to play a role in this critical work for the church at this critical time – please be present at the upcoming Committee Faire and find a place to plug in. As always, the church is better with you.

Finance Committee Report

Through June, normalized year to date revenue fell \$2,689 below year to date expenses. "Normalized" means a monthly income figure that has annualized once-yearly and semi-annual lump-sum gifts into their would-be monthly totals. This is the first time this year there has been a deficit, on a normalized basis. The committee does not believe this is a matter of concern this month. Summer giving frequently lags, because vacation travel can disrupt normal weekly and monthly giving habits, but usually catches up quickly.

The 2019 budget is based on receiving annual average weekly attendance of 158 and an average weekly giving total, per person attending, of \$60. These assumptions produce the budgeted revenue figure of \$488,852. Through June, average weekly attendance of 154 is slightly below the assumed number while average giving per person attending, of \$61, is slightly higher. The annual going rate would produce revenue for the year of \$485,316 - slightly below budget. Attendance has been trending higher in recent months. The cancellation of services on July 7th, due to power issues, will cause us to lose a Sunday's collection. Those of us who give weekly are encouraged to remember to make that week's offering up.

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR CAPITAL CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE

You folks are amazing!! Your response to the call to be <u>Free to Be: the Hands and Feet of Christ</u> has far exceeded our expectations. We were optimistic that the campaign would be successful as we witnessed your participation in and enthusiasm for the small group meetings, but we are blown away by your commitment. As of this writing, we have in hand 89 pledges totaling <u>\$525,766</u>. Equally impressive is the fact that over \$140,000 of the pledges have already been fulfilled! Thus, in July we will be able to make a significant principal reduction on the mortgage. We are well on our way to the freedom we all seek.

As we go forward, we will provide you with periodic updates of the application of campaign proceeds, along with the amounts applied to mortgage principal from the Celebration Fund, BeNuts, and other fundraisers such as the Yard Sale.

One procedural note: for 2020 we will modify the offering envelopes to include a line item for capital campaign contributions. In the meantime, please use the "other" line to designate funds intended to apply to your pledge by writing "Mortgage" or "CapCam" on that line. You may also make such a notation on your check. Or, if you would rather just 'set it and forget it', you can utilize Realm for automatic payment options.

Your participation in and response to the campaign have made this a historic milestone in the life of Cherry Log Christian Church. To commemorate this milestone, we are planning a celebratory "thank you" event featuring Pastor Adam's BBQ and a special musical performance by CLCC's friend John Charping! The Gratitude Dinner will be held on the evening of Friday August 9th, in the Fellowship Hall.


